

Steve Morin - Canadian Meat Council's New President

Steve Morin is a Vice President with one of Canada's largest pork producers Olymel S.E.C. and works out of their Head Office in St. Hyacinthe, Quebec.

Steve was born in Thetford Mines on August 30, 1959. He is bilingual and that makes him very valuable as the next President of the Canadian Meat Council. In addition he holds a Bachelors in Business Administration from Université Laval from 1983 and is a Chartered Accountant.
